

Church @ Home: How to Get Started

Set a time

- Set a time for you and your household to gather to watch a service.
- Have a set schedule to help you be consistent in watching a service.
- Dedicate at least 1 hour to worship God.

Set it up

- Choose a device with internet connection such as a computer, tablet, smart phone or smart TV to watch a service.
- You can watch a live service at 8:30 am (traditional) or 10 am (modern) by:
 - visiting wooddale.org/live
 - streaming it on Wooddale's Facebook page
 - watching it on the Wooddale app.
- If you need help connecting to a live service, call 952-944-6300.
- Miss the live service? You can also watch the recorded versions by visiting wooddale.org/live and clicking "Watch Again" or following the link to the recorded traditional service.

Set the tone

- Turn off and put away all other devices and activities, just as if you were at church.
 - Church is an opportunity for community! If you have kids, encourage them to sit and watch the service with you. Invite your friends and neighbors to join too!
 - Use the discussion guides on the Church @ Home resource center to talk about what you learned and took away from the service.
 - If you're watching the service with others, consider adding coffee, tea or food to your fellowship.
 - If you're watching the service alone, take time to connect with God through prayer and engage with others through social media by using the hashtag [#wooddalechurchathome](#).
